

OVERSEAS STUDENTS FEES 2016-17

Fees will be charged to cover the costs of the student's learning programme where the College is unable to gain funding from the Education Funding Agency. Fees as indicated will normally be payable by students who do not meet any of the exemptions listed:

THREE OR MORE SUBJECTS (FT) – per course for each year

AS/A2 levels, BTEC or equivalent £6500

*** Tuition fee exemptions**

Students who are aged under 19 on 31 August in the calendar year when their programme of study commences are exempt from the payment of tuition fees for accredited courses providing they meet one of the following conditions:

- i. Have status as:
 - British Citizens
 - British Overseas Territory Citizens
 - Holders of a British passport endorsed with a right of abode in the UK
 - Holders of a European Union passport
 - Holders of a certificate of naturalisation or registration as a British Citizen
- ii. Have indefinite leave to enter or remain in the UK and have been ordinarily resident in the UK for the 3 years immediately preceding the start of the learning programme. (Temporary absences are ignored as well as absences where the student has accompanied a parent who has been temporarily working abroad).
- iii. Are accompanying or joining parents or relevant family members who have the right of abode or leave to enter or remain in the UK or are EEA Nationals or are children of diplomats.
- iv. Have recently settled status (meaning those who have been granted indefinite leave to enter or remain in the UK or right of abode or British Citizenship within the 3 years immediately preceding the start of the learning programme).
- v. Are entering the UK (where not accompanied by their parents) and are British or EEA citizens or whose passports have been endorsed to either show that they have the right of abode in the UK or to show that they have no restrictions on working in the UK.
- vi. Have refugee status or humanitarian protection or discretionary leave or exceptional leave to enter or remain in the UK or who are asylum seekers.
- vii. Are children of Turkish workers where the Turkish worker has been lawfully employed and resident in the UK in the past and where the student has been resident in the EEA and Turkey for the full 3 year period prior to the commencement of the learning programme.
- viii. Are studying under reciprocal exchange agreements or dependents of teachers on teacher exchange schemes.
- ix. Are placed in the care of social services (including unaccompanied asylum seekers).
